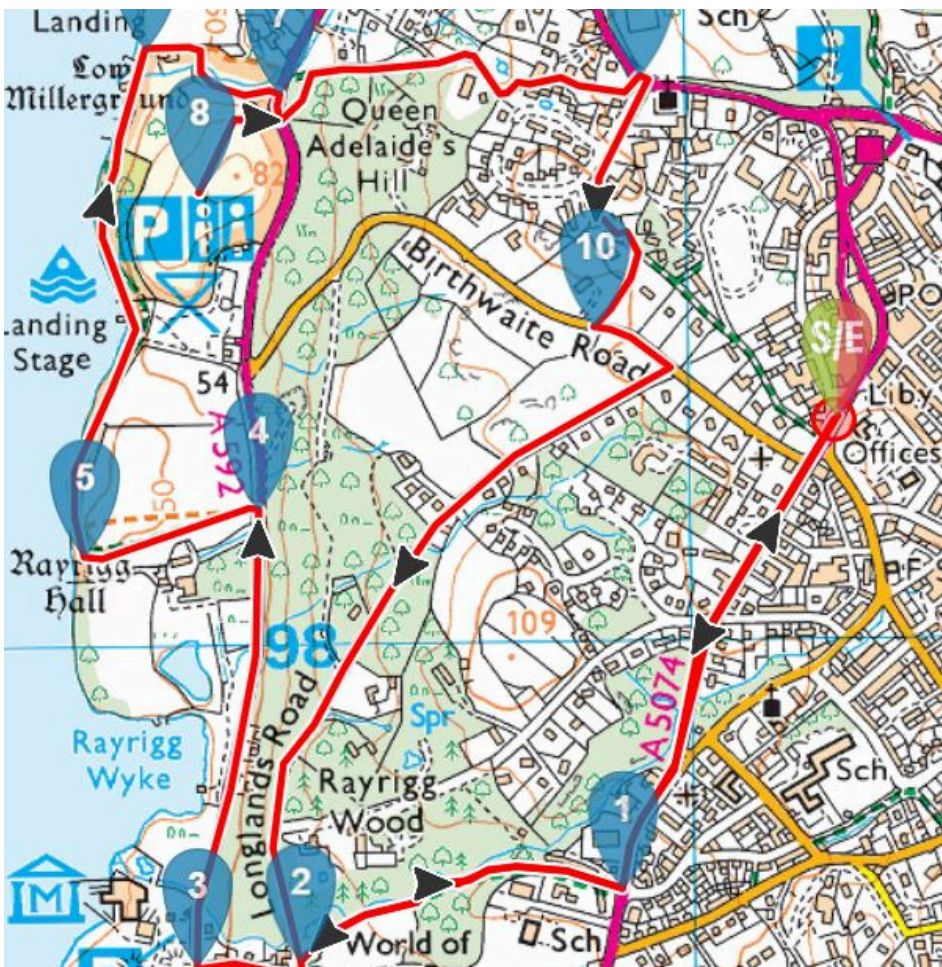

Circular Walk Queen Adelaide's Hill

Description

Queen Adelaide's Hill, a prominent headland overlooking Windermere, offers stunning panoramic views of the Langdales to the North and other areas of the Lake District. Here's a guide to a rewarding walk from Windermere.

The Walk

- (S) Start in Windermere Village and set off down New Road (A5074) towards Bowness
- (2) Opposite the entrance to Queen's Drive on the left of the road, is a footpath heading alongside a row of cottages on your right. Take this path and continue through woodland and alongside a stream.
- (3) At the end of the path, turn left and then immediately right to follow the narrow road down towards the lake
- (4) At the main road, turn right along Rayrigg Road past the Windermere Jetty Museum
- (5) Cross the road at the entrance to Rayrigg Hall to take a path across the field down to the lakeshore
- (6) Turn right to follow the meandering path that continues past jetties and landing stages until you reach a boathouse
- (7) Turn right to follow the track uphill alongside Wynlass Beck taking time to enjoy the turbulent waters rushing by
- (8) At the road turn right for around 50 yards and then turn right again to follow the track up to the top of Queen Adelaide's Hill.
- (9) Retrace your steps and at the road cross directly to follow the path back up towards the main road. When you come out at the church, turn right and right again to take a footpath to Birthwaite Road
- (10) At the road, turn right and after a short walk you will see a small metalled road on your right. Take this past the houses and then into woodland. You will eventually reach Waypoint 3 where you came out of the woodland. Turn left here to retrace your steps back to the start point (S/E)
